


Will I spoil my child if I give too much praise?

ALWAYS ON THEIR BACK

The safest way for babies to sleep is alone in their own bed and not sharing a bed or cosleeping with their parents, other children, or animals.



tioners, bumper pads, or other items in the baby's sleep area.

Babies should always be placed to sleep on their backs





every time they are put to sleep!

This is important for naps, nighttime sleep, sleep after feedings, and when other caregivers are putting the baby to sleep. A baby who normally sleeps on its back but is then placed on its

stomach to sleep is at an especially high risk of SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome).

PRAISE IS IMPORTANT

Praise helps children try new things and know that you like what they are doing. Praise helps children learn how to:

- Share
- Respect others
- Feel good about themselves

Praising small things is im-

portant. Praise can be a hug, a smile, a touch, or a few words such as:

- Good listening
- Thanks for trying
- You tried hard
- You'll get it
- You can do it
